Residential Services

All programs are funded through the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

Referrals

Veteran Administration Case Managers, client self-referrals and community referrals. Admission must be approved by Veterans Administration prior to program admission.

Requirements

Varies by program but all require Veterans to meet HUD definition of homeless, military discharge of any discharge other than dishonorable.

Length of Stay

2 year maximum for Grant Per Diem Veterans programs at Liberty Landing and Brandon Hall. Safe Haven has a 6 month limit and the Healthcare for Homeless Veterans Contract Residential Program at Brandon Hall has a 6 month limit.

30 beds total with a dedicated area for 6 female residents are provided through the Grant and Per Diem Program. 15 Bridge Housing beds for Veterans transitioning into permanent housing within 90 days of admission and 15 Service Intensive beds for Veterans that are needing a longer stay.

25-bed facility with 2 beds for women is a specialized version of the Healthcare for Homeless Veterans Contractual Residential Program. As a housing first, harm reduction program, Veterans who are not substance free can be residents. Residents are expected to work with cases managers and the behavioral health clinician towards a lifestyle conducive to stable housing. Maximum length of stay is six months.

Requirements

Veterans or Veteran spouses and children must be homeless or at risk of becoming homeless (served an eviction notice).

Referrals

Potential clients can call the toll-free number to get started in the process. The SSVF program improves the housing stability of very low-income veteran families by providing intensive case management and assisting participants to obtain VA and other community benefits. Veterans can be connected with benefits such as vocational and rehabilitation counseling, job training and educational assistance, health care referral, transportation, legal service referral, child care and other services.
